FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are the compliance dates?

Group 1 (A-C) compliance period is Feb. 1, 2016 to Jan. 31, 2019. The deadline to report is Feb. 1, 2019. You must have completed the necessary hours and returned your sign-in sheet to LACBA by Jan. 31, 2019.

Group 3 (N-Z) compliance period is Feb. 1, 2017 to Jan. 31, 2020. The deadline to report is Feb. 1, 2020. You must have completed the necessary hours and returned your sign-in sheet to LACBA by Jan. 31, 2020.

Group 2 (H-M) compliance period is Feb. 1, 2018 to Jan. 31, 2021. The deadline to report is Feb. 1, 2021. You must have completed the necessary hours and returned your sign-in sheet to LACBA by Jan. 31, 2021.

Can part of the CLE-Bundle be used to meet my current compliance period, and the remainder utilized toward my next compliance period?

No, the CLE-Bundle can only be used to meet your current compliance period, even if all six hours are not needed.

What are the MCLE requirements specified by the State Bar of California?

The State Bar requires that attorneys complete 25 hours of MCLE within their assigned three year compliance period. Of the 25 hours, the following must be completed in the required subject areas: at least 4 hours in Legal Ethics, 1 hour in Recognition and Elimination of Bias in the Legal Profession and Society, and 1 hour in Competence Issues. Up to half of the required 25 hours may be taken as self-study credit. Self-study credit is self-reported to the State Bar.

Does the CLE-Bundle meet the required subject areas?

Yes. The CLE-Bundle contains 4 hours in Legal Ethics, 1 hour in Recognition and Elimination of Bias in the Legal Profession and Society, and 1 hour in Competence Issues.

Is the CLE-Bundle eligible for participatory and/or self-study credit?

All or part of the CLE-Bundle may be used for participatory credit. The State Bar also allows up to 12.5 hours of credit to be obtained by self-study.

Can I turn in a copy of the sign-in sheet and keep the original?

You must sign and return the original sign-in sheet, which we have printed on special cream-colored paper. Photocopies will not be accepted.

Should I keep a photocopy of my sign-in sheet for my records?

Yes, we recommend that you make a photocopy of your sign-in sheet for your records. Remember to send in the original signed sign-in sheet to LACBA.

What if I lose or ruin my original sign-in sheet?

Please contact LACBA Member Services at 213.896.6560 and we will mail you another original sign-in sheet, which will be marked as a special replacement original. A request for a replacement sign-in sheet is not accompanied by an extension. All sign-in sheets must still be received by Jan. 31 of your specified compliance year.

Where do I return the CLE-Bundle sign-in sheet?

Sign-in sheets returned by mail should be postmarked no later than Jan. 29 of your compliance year. You may also submit your original sign-in sheet in person at the above address by the Jan. 31 deadline. Due to the large volume of sign-in sheets to be processed, a Certificate of Attendance cannot be picked up in person or processed on-the-spot. Sign-in sheets received after the Jan. 31 deadline or postmarked later than Jan. 29 will not be processed unless you have an extension from the State Bar.

Can I share the CLE-Bundle with another attorney?

No. Part of the fee from the CLE-Bundle includes the cost of processing the paperwork required to meet the State Bar's MCLE requirements.

Can I use the CLE-Bundle to meet the MCLE requirements if I am also licensed in another state?

You must contact the bar association(s) of the additional states in which you are licensed to determine whether or not this product will meet its MCLE requirements. Each state sets its own requirements.
