

Jeanne L. Nishimoto is the Supervising Attorney of the Preventing and Ending Homelessness Project at Inner City Law Center, a non-profit law firm. The Preventing and Ending Homelessness Project provides holistic legal services to people who are currently experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk of homelessness.

Prior to joining ICLC, Jeanne worked at the Legal Aid Foundation of Los Angeles, first as a staff attorney and later as the Pro Bono Training Manager. In her practice, she advocated on behalf of low-income clients and communities through direct representation, affirmative litigation, and policy work. She focused on issues relating to housing, government benefits, and civil rights. As the Pro Bono Training Manager, Jeanne oversaw the Pro Bono Training Institute, a statewide collaboration that provides trainings to legal services volunteers throughout California. She has presented at several state and national legal conferences on strategies to leverage technology and volunteers to close the Justice Gap.

She earned her J.D., cum laude, from the University of Michigan Law School and her undergraduate degree from Amherst College.
